




As we are silent,

All Week we have been thinking about **Remembrance** and our response to conflict as peace makers. We read some lovely stories, 'Where The Poppies Now Grow', 'Flo of the Somme' and today, 'Peace Lily'. These books are very familiar with the children.

Both books tell the story of Ben and Ray, along with a dog called Flo and their good friend, Lily. The books introduce the realities of human war experiences alongside themes of **remembrance**, **friendship** and **peace**.

On Friday, as well as our Collective Worship / Assembly, we held our **Act of Remembrance** as a School at 11am so the children are prepared for the lead up to **11am on the 11th day, of the 11th month**. Holding our 2 minute silence in School was just as meaningful as in previous years.

Remembering is so important, but even more so, learning from the past and showing our Values for Victory; taking our places as **global citizens**. This year is more poignant than others years where we were able to reflect on the current conflicts in our world. Northway pupils want to take their responsibility seriously.
